not have that - always do.

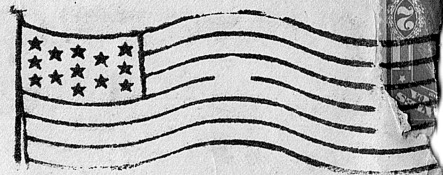
I'm going to town
